

SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT LEGAL STATUS

Kansas statute provides that the Board shall appoint a qualified superintendent, not a member of the board, for a term of not more than three years. In the event that any vacancy occurs in the office of the superintendent, the Board shall promptly fill such vacancy. Such vacancy may either be filled by the appointment of an acting superintendent until the first day of August next following such an appointment, or may be filled by appointment of a superintendent. The superintendent of schools shall have charge and control of the public schools of the unified district subject to the orders, rules and regulations of the board, and shall receive for his services such compensation as the board shall allow.
