## Stay in Touch

Some parents don't realize their child is having a problem until the report card comes home. But, by acting early, you can work with your child's teacher to solve problems before they get out of hand. Here are some ways busy parents can monitor their children's school performance.

- ✓ Set a regular time for homework. Be a good example by doing some work yourself at the same time. While your child is doing school work, you can sit nearby and pay bills or do other work of your own.
- ✓ Look at tests. When your child brings home a graded test paper, sit down and discuss it. Talk about what they got right – and what they got wrong. Don't nag – just ask your child why they answered the way they did.
- ✓ If your child seems to be having problems, work out a way to communicate regularly with the teacher. You might call once a week to make sure your child has turned in all assignments. Or you and your child's teachers might come up with a checklist that the teacher sends home and you initial.
