MANAGEMENT OF STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES WITH ACQUIRED IMMUNODEFICIENCY SYNDROME (AIDS) HIV INFECTION

Medical research indicates that AIDS/HIV-III cannot be transmitted through casual physical contact. The

school-aged child infected with AIDS/HIV-III presents a negligible risk of transmission to his/her

classmates or to other adult school personnel and thus does not affect their health and safety. For the

same reason, adult school personnel infected with AIDS/HIV-III, under ordinary school circumstances, will

not infect school children or co-workers. Therefore, both children and adult school personnel infected

with AIDS/HIV-III should, in most instances, continue to attend school and to participate fully in programs

and activities.

Removal of a student or an adult employee infected with AIDS/HIV-III from the school setting is normally

not justified. However, guidelines will be established in Administrative Regulation for case by case review

process for any student or school employee known to have AIDS/HIV-III. The Board grants the

superintendent authority to act on the recommendation of the Communicable Disease Evaluation

Advisory Committee (CDEAC) as established in administrative regulations.
