Lunch

Served at Southwest from 11:05 - 12:10 p.m. and at the Central Cafeteria from 11:05 - 12:15 p.m.

Cost - Elementary/Southwest (grades K - 4)	\$2.80
LMS & PHS Students (grades 5 - 12)	\$3.05
Adults	\$3.55
Reduced (all grades)	\$0.40

The Central Cafeteria has a number of options available for all students in grades 5 - 12. There are always 2 main entrees or a salad bar to choose from. Any additional entrees will cost extra. There is also a **Grab and Go** option that includes a sandwich or salad, fruit and a side salad or grain. Grab and Go counts as a standard lunch option.

OPAA Extras (a la carte) - a variety of extra items that can be purchased at the Central Cafeteria.

These items are NOT included in the standard lunch.

If your student qualifies for Free or Reduced price meals, that **DOES** include the standard breakfast and a standard lunch **each** day. It does **NOT** include extra entrees or OPAA Extras. You will be charged and expected to pay for the extra food choices.

When we experienced a computer glitch with PowerLunch in September, records were kept manually and have now been updated on your student's online account. Your student may have a negative balance that accumulated during this time. It is the policy of USD 382 not to allow charging of Extra Items when the account has a negative balance of any amount.

If a student's meal account balance becomes negative, the student will only be allowed to charge a maximum of five standard meals.

If a student has a negative balance that exceeds the cost of five meals, the student will be provided with a cheese sandwich and a milk or another appropriate alternate meal until the account is brought current.


